Scope and Content

Josiah Sidney Hart (1843-1932) was born in Northfield, Vermont. His father was Elder Josiah Hart, a leader in the Advent Movement of 1843-1844. During the 1850s the Hart family moved west. When Elder Hart and his wife died, their eldest daughter, Lucy A. Hart (1840-1922) kept the family together. Prior to entering the ministry, J. S. Hart attended Battle Creek College. During his subsequent 30 years of ministry he started many churches in Iowa and the midwest. In 1872, he married Alice C. Perrigo and about 1890 the Harts moved to College View, Nebraska in order for their daughter, Florence E. Hart (1873-1893), to attend school. Hart's sister Lucy resided with his family during her last 50 years. J. S. Hart died in College View, Nebraska in 1932.

This collection contains diaries, letters, and notes belonging to J. S. Hart and autograph albums belonging to Lucy A. Hart and Florence E. Hart.
