

Everett N. Dick Collar Pins (Small Artifact 17)

Artifact

Six collar pins, a mix of metal, mother-of-pearl, and diamond.

Note from Lorle (although possibly written by Everett Dick): “Dad’s Collar buttons: The ones with pearl base are special-didn’t leave brass spot on the neck. The long hinged ones went in the back of neck. These were used to attach a stiff collar to the collar band. Wore shirt a day or two. Put collar on for an evening.”

Provenance

These collar pins belonged to Everett N. Dick and were given to Union College by his daughter, Lorle Dick Stacey in April 2014. According to Stacey, her father wore them between 1905 and 1930.
